Last Day of School

The Maryland State Board of Education has approved the HCPSS 2014–2015 Calendar Waiver request to waive one instructional day that was lost due to inclement weather. The last student day will now be on Friday, June 19, 2015. All schools will be open for a full day on Wednesday, June 17. All schools will close two hours early for students on Thursday, June 18, and will close three hours early for students on Friday, June 19.

For SJLES, this means:

- Regular school days and closure times through Wednesday, June 17th SJLES closes at 3:15pm.
- Thursday, June 18th, SJLES closes at 1:15pm.
- Friday, June 19th, SJLES closes at 12:15pm.
